

# 4000 watch Surfers score Rules triple

At Salk Oval last Sunday, before 4000 spectators, Surfers Paradise under 13, 16 and senior sides had resounding victories over Southport in the second semifinals and all teams will play off for this years penants on Sunday week.

In a fast opening, Fieldes goaled on the run for Southport, then R. Freestone replied for Surfers. Play was fast and furious. Burns (Southport) was freed and goaled. Anthony, Surfers' dashing rover, with a prodigious kick, sent one bouncing through from 60 yards out. Sutton goaled for Surfers from a free, then Walsh palmed nicely to Duncan who shot truly.

The dashing Anthony picked up on the run and snapped a nice goal, giving Surfers a 19 point lead at the first change.

Best, Southport captain, was coming into his own and goaled twice; Gartan passed to Duncan who put one through for Surfers.

Then Murrel marked from a bad kick-off and goaled for Southport. Play was fast and exciting; Eldridge and Rowe were defending strongly for Southport, then just before the long interval Anthony goaled for Surfers to give them a 12 point lead.

The third quarter was a brilliant one for Surfers. Receiving great drive from their centre line of J. Freestone, Chapman and Gillet, goals came in quick succession by
