## Pies stay cool over proposals by SQAFA

THE South Queensland Australian Football Association has given Southport the cold shoulder in proposals for the Ouccnsland league's controversial 10-team competition - but the Magpies' feathers aren't ruffled in the slightest.

Southport club president Alan Mackenzie said the SQAFA proposals, which ignore the inclusion of Southport in next year's QAFL competition, were unfeasible and unlikely to be accepted because of the small say SQAFA had in QAFL affairs.

SOAFA is a minority body, both in playing ability and numbers on the QAFL." Dr Mackenzie said.

A report from a special QAFL investigation committee has recommended Southport be added to next year's QAFL competition along with a combined team from SQAFA clubs, Sherwood and Mi Gravati

## Wide open

A decision on whether to add the two teams to the eight which are currently in the QAFL competition was expected to be reached on October 5, but SQAFA has thrown the question wide open with its two They are:

That Sherwood and Mt Gravatti be-admitted to the QAFL as separate clubs on a three-year trial basis.

That the QAFL remain an eight-team competition, with an amalgamation of Sherwood and QAFL club Western Districts, another antalgariation of QAFL. "I den't this clubs Kedron and Wilston-Grange, and Mackenzie said.
