Signing on with Southport Magpies, he was the biggest gain for the club and for Gold Coast Rules.

I asked him what the sign-on fee was and he quipped: "It's never enough."

However, while not agreeing with my guess of \$3000, he didn't altogether deny it.

Ryan said he pulled up reasonably well after his first Coast game yesterday week at Salk Oval, Currumbin.

Playing with a com-

bined northern team against a representative southern Coast side, he said: "I didn't kill myself."

Ryan, who played centre half forward, denied a suggestion that he was outmatched by Souths' centre half back,

Kelvin Mills, of Palm Beach-Currumbin.

Elusive ball

"Neither of us saw much of the ball," Big Bill explained,

If this was the case, the former Geolong ruckman did extremely well in kicking five goals when he did get the ball.

Ryan said it takes him a few games to really get going, but he expects to be firing on all pistons from the start of the 1975

premiership competition.

There is only one thing which could prevent Big Bill from playing here the clearance from Coorparoo.

Southport are still waiting for it after making application early this month.
